Roughly 5% (45,387 megawatts) of the state's taxable solar energy produced in 2017 came from four counties in Region 2: Blue Earth, Le Sueur, McLeod, Nicollet. Only three counties in Region 2 have taxable wind energy production. Faribault, Martin, and Watonwan produced about 23% of the state's total taxable wind energy (23,460 megawatt hours).

Minnesota Association of Assessing Officers continues to work with the Department of Revenue in efforts to develop legislative language further clarifying how homesteads are to be administered using deeded fractional interests. The goal is to have amendment language added to the currently proposed legislation (bills <u>HF97</u>, <u>SF516</u>, <u>HF415</u>, <u>SF568</u>) in hopes of making the process clear and easily administrable without causing any unintended consequences throughout the homestead classification system and related programs.
